The Board Role

The Wester Ross Area Salmon Fisheries Board (WRASFB) is the statutory body responsible for the protection and enhancement of salmon and sea trout fisheries in its designated area. It was constituted under the Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries (Consolidation) (Act) Scotland 2003. Salmon fishing rights are private heritable titles that are registered separately from land and as such can be bought or sold like any other property.

District salmon Fishery Boards (DSFBs) finance their work by applying a levy on the salmon fishery proprietors as directed under the 2003 Act. The 2003 Act states that "a district Board shall have the power to impose an assessment, to be known as the fishery assessment, on each salmon fishery in their district. The fishery assessment is assessed at such uniform rate as is determined for all fisheries in the district by the Board and, shall be levied according to the valuation of a fishery as entered into the valuation role".

A DSFB may do such acts, execute such works and incur such expenses as may appear expedient for:

The protection or improvement of the fisheries within their district;

The increase of salmon (or sea trout); or

The stocking of the waters of the district with salmon (and seatrout).

Elected members of those salmon fishery owners (proprietors) form the core membership of the Board with a requirement for representatives of salmon anglers and tenant netsmen being co opted onto the Board.


Board members are elected triennially and the last election took place in November 2015. The elected members then elect one of their number as Chairman before considering candidates for co option to the Board. The current Board members are:

What We Do


Most DSFBs throughout Scotland are responsible for only one river within one catchment and the funding raised by the levies are used to provide protection and enhancement of salmon stocks throughout the whole system where every proprietor sees the benefits.


The WRASFB however, has one of the highest numbers of rivers / catchments within its boundaries so, recognising the geographical extent of the Board area (Kanaird to Applecross) and the high numbers of rivers within it, the WRASFB addresses at Board level, only those tasks which are essential or are most effectively handled centrally as part of the Boards statutory remit. All other basic river management aspects remain with the proprietors.


Graphs for salmon and sea trout for WRASFB meeting October 2018

Salmon











Sea trout

Notes: the relatively large number of finnock released in 2013 include high numbers of River Ewe fish (mostly early returned fish) and Torridon river fish. As for salmon, the corrected figures for the Gruinard river are based on the assumption that all sea trout and finnock were released in 2016.









Fisheries Monitoring

The Board authorises and funds the SWRFT to conduct the electro fishing surveys that are carried out on a bi-annual, rolling programme basis. The Board also authorises and funds the SWRFT in the collation and interpretation of the annual catch returns which along with the electro fishing data is fed into a Marine Scotland model which when interpreted correctly, can assist in determining the health of the juvenile salmon stocks of rivers within the Board area. The Board also authorises and funds the SWRFT in the collation and interpretation of sea-lice data for Board responses to aquaculture planning.

Fisheries Management

Whilst the physical day to day fisheries management aspects are left to the proprietors discretion, the Board, with assistance from SWRFT, deals with all aquaculture and hydro planning applications. These are taking up a lot more time than might seem possible as there are currently no full planning applications in the system. There is a screening and scoping request for the TSSC farm at Aird in Loch Torridon.

Skye, again, has had an influx of applications, some of which are on Skye's east coast so have the potential to directly impact on the Applecross area. We have therefore been assisting the Skye Board with their responses in an attempt to help manage any impacts that could affect Wester Ross.

Fisheries Protection

The WRASFB levy income means it is not financially possibly to employ any full time water bailiffs but it authorises those who have passed the IFM bailiff qualification course. Although directly employed by individual fisheries, combined operations within the Board area have been carried out. The Scottish Government moratorium on coastal / mixed stock netting operations throughout Scotland, continues to be in force. This, along with all rivers in Wester Ross falling under a category 3 status, makes the killing of wild salmon within Wester Ross.....an offence.

The Board has access to a fully compliant and MCA coded vessel and coastal net patrols are being carried out in various locations throughout the Board area. The number of coastal patrols fell slightly during 2018 due to higher fuel and running costs. These costs will need to be discussed, agreed and budgeted for if these operations are to continue.

Predator Monitoring/Management

There were reports of increased numbers of piscivorous duck sightings throughout the board area last year. The Board instigated a monitoring system which relied on numbers of sightings being reported to the Board in order for them to collate the data and apply for an annual control licence. Report forms were sent out by email to all proprietors, no returns have been made.

Fisheries Development

This buzz phrase is still being driven by a perception that there is any amount of fishing available, but not let. Here on the west the bigger rivers are usually fully booked during their normal fishing season. For others that are fully dependant on rain, anglers are still not keen to buy any days on rivers that may or may not have water....or fish.

Wild Fisheries Reform

As reported to you all in last year's Annual report, there are many parts of the WFR that are not being taken forward by the Scottish Government due to a lack of funding on their part. There will still be changes in 2018/2019 but these will be greatly reduced and will rely on "voluntary" actions by Boards with the potential for a one off funding package to facilitate the merging of one or more contiguous Boards.

Having now looked at all of the aspects in merging with the Skye DSFB, when the one off funding package to facilitate the merger is used up, we can see no viable economy of scale benefits over such a wide spread area. At this time, without any continuous funding from the Scottish Government to maintain the necessary administrative burden, we see no benefit in an amalgamation. http://news.gov.scot/news/wild-fisheries

Construction and objectives

The board was created on 19 February 2004 by the formation of an association of proprietors of the Wester Ross Salmon Fishery District, and the election of a committee, under the terms of the Salmon and Freshwater Fisheries (Consolidation) (Scotland) Act 2003.

The purposes of the Board are to do such acts, execute such works and incur such expenses as may appear to them expedient for the protection or improvement of the fisheries within their district, the increase of salmon, or the stocking of the waters of the district with salmon.

The board is empowered by statute to raise an annual levy on the proprietors to allow it to meet its expenses.

Results for the period

The Deficit for the year was £2,006 (2017: Deficit £371) as shown on the revenue account.
